Discussion:

Member Zullas indicated that the need for Executive Session may be needed, but under the guidance of Town Counsel since the SBC will only be discussing feasibility, Open Session may be a better forum. Therefore, the SBC did not vote to enter Executive Session.

Member Hoffman shared his conceptual layouts of the proposed Middle School (DRA's design at Brush Hill Road). Other school programs that Member Hoffman has worked on, did not fit within the proposed site. Documents showed zoning offsets that make the overall parcel 'tighter' due to offsets. The school building fits on site when 'straightened', however required other (parking, access roads, playgrounds and other amenities) do not fit.

Member Hoffman indicated that due to sloping of site, ADA and Mass Arch Access Board perspective, this site would be very difficult. There would be an large effort to make the site accessible at the building

Member Zullas requested if we reviewed the upper lots in conjunction with the lower lot. Member Hoffman indicated that this upper lot may help with the parking, but with ADA access to the building (on the lower lot), the upper lots are not associated.

Member Loring provided an update from the Milton Historic Commission (MHC). MHC indicated that they see the existing buildings have significant historical significance. SBC should avoid demolition of these buildings.

Mass Historic Commission (MHC) also view this with significant historical significance. MHC would have regulatory oversight. They would require an alternatives analysis.

Member Tereshak indicated there is costs associated with acquiring the site, significant costs associated with land work and other factors would make this an expensive site and most likely cost-prohibitive.

Member Hurley indicated that previous decision matrix may want to be used for evaluating this site against others.

Chair O'Rourke has contacted DRA for initial feedback. SBC could engage DRA under contract. Questions from members arose on why would we spend the funding on a site we (SBC) know does not work.

Discussion of access road through site was presented. The slope of the overall site would be challenging for an access road, turning radii of busses would need to be evaluated, modifications to historic stone walls and other items would need to be evaluated.

Most children would use this site only by bussing, due to lack of sidewalks on Blue Hills and Brush Hill.

Chair O'Rourke indicated that this site could be acquired quicker leading to a lower project cost (due to reduced escalation), however if the overall project is more expensive (due to land acquisition costs, site preparation costs and other factors), it makes the decision to acquire this site challenging.

Member Zullas provided a timeline for a special Town Meeting and associated debt exclusion vote, that would require SBC deciding on these parcels in a faster manner.

Chair O'Rourke asked Member Zullas if the request from the Select Board would want a recommendation (Yea or Nay) from the SBC what to do with the parcels. Member Zullas indicated that if we actions taken (buy the property), we would need to advise the Select Board that is does/does not want the parcels.
